



Inspection of Fall Protection Equipment

Duration 1 Day

Introduction

The PPE Regulations 1992, and Work at Height Regulations 2005 require employers to maintain Personal Fall Protection Equipment in good repair, and conduct Inspections at suitable intervals.

This training session will give nominated persons the knowledge and ability to establish and implement an Inspection regime on behalf of the employer, and will also provide them with the necessary skills to competently inspect fall protection equipment, and decide what action is to be taken when finding defects.

This course focuses on the inspection of Personal Fall Protection Equipment predominantly made from Webbing or Rope, and does not cover other types of PPE, or equipment such as installed anchor points.

Who Should Attend?

Nominated persons who issue/maintain Personal Fall Protection Equipment on behalf of their employer.

Training Methods

A high proportion of hands on demonstrations and practical exercises, supplemented with classroom based tutorials, comprehensive handout pack. Post course assessment will be by completing inspections on items of equipment, writing reports on these items and by a multiple choice test paper.
