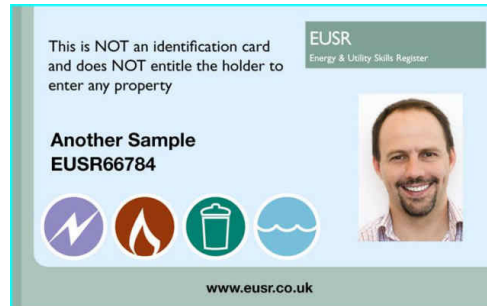




National Water Hygiene Scheme (Water Hygiene Card)



Course Specification

Aim: To provide an understanding of the need for good hygiene, when working with potable water.

Objectives:

- To ensure that all individuals are aware of the ways in which potable water could be contaminated.
- To ensure that individuals who work with potable water understand that it is their responsibility not to allow the water to become polluted.
- To ensure that individuals reach a nationally agreed level of training, testing and medical clearance. The objective is that individuals answer successfully at least 22 out of 25 questions in the National Water Hygiene test.

There are three elements to the training package:

- Completion of a Health Screening Questionnaire
- Participation on the training course
- Successful completion of the National Water Hygiene test

All three elements must be successfully completed before a National Water Hygiene card will be issued.

Course Content: The course consists of a series of slides using Microsoft PowerPoint software.

Group Size: The maximum number is twelve; two courses can be run in one day - morning and afternoon or evening to suit you.

Duration: Normally about three hours including the test.

Validity: The cards are registered on the EUSR register and are valid for three years.

The National Water Hygiene Scheme is delivered through a network of trainers who have been trained and approved by EU Skills. All trainers deliver the same course content, health assessment and test.

Following successful completion of the course the trainer will submit the necessary paperwork and payment to EU Skills for registration.
